

To continue to save children and their communities from the illnesses and complications that come from unclear water, Living Waters for the World seeks to increase the number of available trainers through its newly created training program, Clean Water U.

With a grant from the Birthday Offering, Living Waters for the World will expand the number of students attending Clean Water U training sessions, empower more mission team leaders to equip their congregations and subsequently install more water systems around the world. The grant will also assist Living Waters for the World in promoting awareness about its program throughout the Presbyterian Church (USA). Over a three-year period, additional and expanded training sessions will prepare approximately 150 additional mission teams to install clean water systems.

Living Waters for the World

The need for clean water in our world is overwhelming. More than 3 million people, most of them children, die each year from illnesses related to contaminated water. Living Waters for the World equips mission teams with the skills needed to form partnerships with communities in need of clean water.

These teams install the Living Waters for the World clean water system and equip local community leaders to operate these systems long-term. Systems have been installed in Mexico, Haiti, Brazil, India, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Ghana, Dominican Republic, Thailand, Kenya, Peru, El Salvador, Belize, the Philippines, Ghana and the United States. Each clean water system can supply up to 300 people with clean drinking and cooking water at a cost of one cent per gallon of potable water.
